# What Is A Prepper Group?

- Formal Prepper Groups: Likely to have an organized paramilitary like structure with a chain of command and rank structure. Similar in nature to a militia but solely focused on defending an area or community and maintaining a sense of normalcy within their area of control.
- **Informal Prepper Group:** An loose association of like minded people who will  $\bullet$ come together and assist one another in a disaster. May be made up of family and friends, work associates, etc.
- Bug Out Prepper Groups: Those people who are planning to leave an area and go to a pre-established location together. The may have pre-positioned supplies, purchased land, etc.
- **Bug In Prepper Groups:** Those people who are planning to stay in an area and ride out the disaster where they currently live, unless they are forced to move to another location.



# The Goal Of This Lesson

- Hopefully this lesson will provide you with some ideas about places that you can look to find like minded people who may already be into preparedness or have a tendency towards being more self reliant.
- This can be a difficult task and it will require you to get out and take part in various types of activities.
- It will also require you to get to know people and form relationships with them to determine if they might be suitable candidates as a potential member to your group.
- All of the areas that are listed in this lesson are places, groups, and clubs that many preppers already frequent. But it will be up to you to get out to these places and make human connections to identify who will be the right fit for you and your new group.
